

## The eResettlement Initiative: In Three Realms

This project aims to take a pioneering effort to digitize resettlement center services by introducing enterprise standard web-platform to provide eVolunteering, ESL services, job referrals, and accommodation matching. Seasonal volunteerism has left so many new community members without immediate help. Jobs are sought after with words of mouth in metro areas, such as in DC, MN, and MA. My aspiration is to circumvent such challenge starting from a small community to several resettlement centers across the nation.

<b>Project Summary</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Revitalizing Afterschool Programs: <i>La' Cruz Community Center:</i> About 123 youth residents actively participate in the literacy development segment. <i>St. Cloud Area Somali Salvation Org:</i> About twenty community members per day attend an after school program offered at this center. Despite their limited space, both programs strive to meet students' need under scarce resources.</li> <li>➤ Revitalizing Learning Centers: New families at Maine Prairie Apt. have been using a garage as a learning site. Read Aloud brought 16 out of 80 residents (between the age of seven and fifties).</li> </ul>	<b>Project Summary</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Coordinating volunteers and newly arriving community members for service; providing ESL tutoring and job referrals are some of the common challenges faced by most resettlement centers. These were also SCSU Read Aloud problems faced from the very beginning. Moreover, the difficulty of motivating student volunteers was hard by its own. Our Read Aloud Service Challenge showed some progress despite the fact that service was still about the fourth task after school work, part-time job, and recreational/social activity.</li> </ul>	<b>Project Summary</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ In 2011, I have attended a meeting held between 150 newly arriving community residents and District 742 officials; I witnessed the outcry of considerable number of English Language Learners (ELL) consignments to curriculums which do not allow them to move into mainstream classes as a result of being categorized as students with learning disabilities.</li> </ul>
